DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH



PURPOSE / SCOPE OF BRIDGE COURSE

As part of the orientation program for the academic year 2024–2025, the Department of English (Shift II) offered a bridge course titled "Play with English" for first-year students. The course aimed to acquaint students with domain-specific learning as per the Tansche modules and enhance their understanding of the play-way method for learning English. The course was meticulously executed according to a pre-designed timetable. The bridge course activities were designed to improve students' LSRW (Listening, Speaking, Reading, Writing) skills and were approved by the Dean and Deputy Dean.

Objectives

The main objectives of the Bridge Course were to:

- Assist students in improving their academic abilities in English and bridge gaps in writing, reading, and speaking.
- Enable learners to express themselves and encourage independent thinking in English.
- Familiarize students with an English-speaking classroom environment.
- Support students in developing fundamental LSRW skills.

Separate teams for both batches were formed by Dr. Sreevidhya to conduct the Bridge Course. While these teams focused on the bridge course, other staff members substituted II-year classes to ensure the smooth conduct of the program.

Methodology

All first-year students admitted during the academic year 2024-25 attended the bridge course. Faculty members followed a structured timetable and incorporated various activities to engage students. The course employed play-way learning methods to focus on both subjective and emotional development.

Principles of the Play-Way Method:

1. Teachers create activities suited to students' capacities and needs.
2. Learning methods relate to real life rather than books.
3. This method provides opportunities for students to express themselves in public scenarios.
4. It is part of the OBE (outcome-based education) and student-centered learning process.

Implementation :

The sessions for both Batch I & II were handled according to the schedule designed by Dr. Sreevidhya and conducted smoothly. All sessions took place at the Indoor Stadium on the college premises. Students participated enthusiastically in all activities. The bridge course was conducted over two hours on the days allotted from 9.00 am to 11.00 am, 11.15 a.m. to 1.15 p.m. and 3.45 pm to 5.45 p.m on 2nd, 3rd and 4th of July 2024. It was attended by freshers of all the departments. The course aimed to equip students with essential English language skills, emphasizing LSRW, and highlighting the significance of English communication in a college setting. It included ice-breaking sessions, skit performances, situational dialogues, and story narration. The session concluded with freshers singing English songs. Ultimately, the Bridge Course – Play with English successfully helped students speak English confidently, think critically, express their ideas, enrich their vocabulary, and develop coherent sentences.

Some of the activities conducted included:

- Ice-breaking sessions
- Motivational speeches by students
- Singing along with karaoke lyrics of English songs
- Role plays
- Rhyming words
- Grammar quizzes

Additional activities introduced to students incorporated cinema and music to engage adolescents. Students participated in games like "The Rolling Bag Game," brainstorming Hollywood actors' names and movies, and singing pop songs to showcase their understanding of BBC pronunciation.

To effectively execute the Bridge Course – Play with English, interactive and flipped classroom methods were largely employed. Activities such as "Sketch out your Neighbour," "Story Relay," "Catch the Tail," and "Story Narration" were utilized to encourage students to contemplate, frame sentences, and speak confidently in front of others. These activities ensured active participation from all students.

DEPARTMENT OF SOFTWARE APPLICATION



1 year orientation programme and Bridge Course was conducted in the following method from 01/07/2024 to 06/07/2024

Mentor – Mentee Meeting, Orientation, Campus Tour Mentors and mentees got acquainted, discussed expectations, and established meeting frequency. Students received information about faculty, courses, mentors, and roll numbers. A discussion on mentor roles and grievance communication was included. Students introduced themselves, and grievances were addressed. Students toured key locations including the computer lab, New Block, canteen, indoor stadium, Annex Block, sports field, Cricket Ground, volleyball court, boys' hostel, and basketball court. Instructions on "Dos and Don'ts" on campus were provided.

Pre-Assessment Basic Computer Skills Test, Alumni/Expert Talk, Talent Hunt

Students completed a Basic Computer Skills assessment test via Quizizz.com to evaluate their ability to use digital tools such as email, word processing software, and web browsing. Students participated in activities to showcase their talents, including dancing and storytelling, helping them understand their strengths and prepare for future careers.

Domain-Specific Lecture, UHV Universal Human Values, Personality Development Introduced domain-specific knowledge and activities demonstrating the use of algorithms in daily life, such as cooking recipes, search engine methods, bicycle assembly instructions, and solving a Rubik's cube.

Discussed human values as per NEP 2020, including topics like friendship, healthy eating habits, communication skills, and stress management. Students shared their views and experiences.

Focused on self-improvement and character-building, including self-awareness, mindfulness, growth mindset, and emotion management. Other sessions conducted were Let Us Connect with social media, Peace Education Program Domain-Specific Lecture 2 - Statistics and Computer Science.

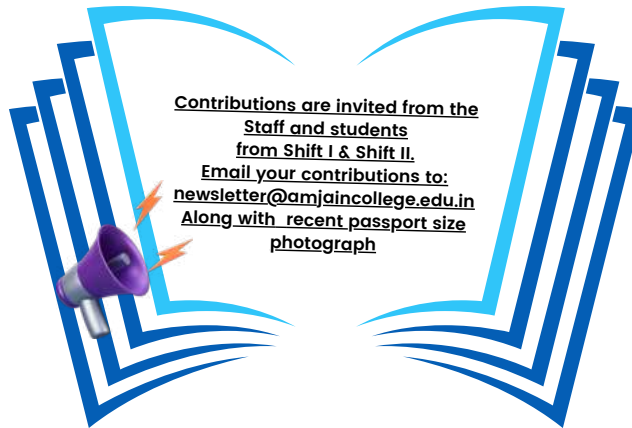
